

Hoop and Accessory Holder



This is a storage idea to hold your embroidery hoops or rulers. Hang it from a door for easy access or zip it closed to take it to class. All your hoops, templates and accessories are in one handy hanging organizer. Separate pockets keep your hoops from getting scratched.



One large pocket at the bottom can be zipped closed. Small pockets at the bottom are handy for small accessories. Two of the pockets are embellished with a combination of built in embroidery designs from the Horizon 15000, featured in the Embroidery Editing videos in the My 15000 app for the iPad.

What you will need

- 🧵 2 1/2 yds of 60" Canvas
It is sturdy and both sides look the same so you don't have to add a lining.
- 🧵 Pockets, cut as follows:
 - 18" x 14"
 - (2) - 18" x 16"
 - 18" x 18"
 - 18" x 20"
- 🧵 Body, cut as follows:
 - 18" x 58"
- 🧵 4" x 12" for handle or 24" of webbing
- 🧵 (2) 2" x 12" fusible interfacing
- 🧵 7/8 yd coordinating fabric, cut as follows
 - (11) - 2" x width of fabric strips for binding on pockets and perimeter.
 - 1 3/4" x width of fabric strips to bind the edge of the zippers
- 🧵 (1) 24" and (1) 18" piece of continuous zipper by the yard
(Available from many Internet suppliers - search for YKK #5 coil continuous zipper) or get 24" and 18" standard zippers
- 🧵 (2) 1/2" x 18" dowels
- 🧵 Small piece of velcro (3" x 2")
- 🧵 Thread to match binding and denim
- 🧵 Embroidery supplies for design (optional)
- 🧵 Janome Quilt Binder part #202211008 (optional)
- 🧵 Zipper foot
- 🧵 Dual Feed foot (optional)

Construction


1. Center and fuse interfacing to the wrong side of the two handle pieces. Fold the long edges, wrong sides together, at the edge of the interfacing. Fold the short edges to the wrong side about 3/8". Fold in half again and press. Edge stitch all four sides. Set aside.
2. Place an embroidery design centered on the 14" and one of the 16" pockets. We used the design constructed in the Embroidery Editing videos in the My15000 app for the iPad.



3. Place an embroidery design centered on the 14" and one 16" pocket.
4. Stitch the 2" binding sections together end to end, forming one long section.
5. Stitch the 1 3/4" strips for the zipper binding together end to end.
6. Bind the top edges of all the pockets with the 2" binding strips. I love the Janome Quilt Binder for this. It folds and stitches in one step. I like to use an even feed foot instead of the foot that comes with the attachment. It works much better.




7. Bind the bottom edge of the embroidered pockets. These two will have the binding on the top and bottom edges.
8. Bind the edges of the tab.
9. Stitch velcro to the wrong side of one short edge of the tab and set aside.
10. Bind the edges of the 24" zippers with the 1 3/4" strips.
11. Add fabric tabs to the 24" zippers. You will stitch one tab at the closed end. Open the zipper and stitch fabric tabs on each zipper end to form stops.



12. Add fabric tabs to both ends of the 18" zipper. These tabs enclose both sides of the zipper at each end.
13. Bind the top edge of the 18" zipper. Place the right side of the binding to the wrong side of the zipper. The edges of the zipper and the fabric will be even. Stitch close to the zipper teeth. Fold the binding around the edge of the zipper. Tuck in the raw edge. Pin and stitch close to this edge. Do not fold in the ends of the binding on the zipper.
14. Place the 18" pocket on top of the bottom edge of the zipper. The bound edge will be next to the zipper teeth.

16. Place the zippered pocket on the larger canvas about 12 1/2" from the bottom edge. Pin in place.
17. Stack the three largest pockets on the canvas. The largest pocket will be about 7" from the top edge. The bottom of the pockets will be even. This will stagger the pockets 2" apart. **Note:** Do not add the embroidered pocket yet. This illustration is not an exact proportion, just a guide to placement.



18. Stitch across the bottom edge of the three larger pockets to the backing.
19. Stitch the top and bottom bound edges of the zipper pocket to the backing.
20. Now add the embroidered pocket. Cover the raw edges of the first three pockets with the bound bottom edge of the pocket. Stitch in place. Stitch both edges of the binding.
21. Stitch the sides 1/4" from the edge to hold the pocket layers together. Trim if necessary.
22. Bind the outside edge with the Janome Quilt Binder, or fold the binding over the edges and stitch in place. Miter the corners.
23. Place this section right side up.
24. Mark each side just below the top pockets. This will NOT be the center of the backing.

25. Open the zipper and place the RIGHT side of the zipper on the pocket side of the organizer along the outside edge. The zipper teeth will be to the outside edge. The top and bottom ends of the zipper will not be as long because the sides and the bottom will have a larger fabric section than the top. This allows for a small fold up pocket at the bottom.



26. Match the binding edge of the zipper with the inside bound edge of the large pocket section. Stitch the edges together, along the bound edge of the zipper. Do not stitch close to the zipper. You will have about 1 " of zipper that will not be stitched at the center of the hanger (the bottom of the zipper) This leaves an opening at the fold line.



27. After the zipper is stitched you will pull the tab through the opening to the outside. When you zip it up the zipper will be on the outside.
28. Zip up the sides. Place a mark $\frac{3}{4}$ " above the ends of the zipper on both ends. Unzip and fold the ends to the right side at this mark and press.
29. Stitch a casing 1 " from the fold. Check to make sure the dowel fits.
30. Center and stitch a handle on the wrong sides at each end. Make sure the stitching does not extend any farther than the stitching line for the casing.
31. Fold the bottom edge up on the fold line. Stitch 1 " from the fold forming a casing.
32. Center the velcro tab between the ends of the bottom handle on the wrong side. Stitch the short binding edge on both sides..
33. Stitch the remaining velcro on the top, back about 3 " from the edge of the fold. Fold and zip to decide exactly where the velcro needs to be.
34. Match the side edges of the small bottom pocket with the backing. Stitch the edges together stopping at the casing line. Divide this pocket with vertical stitching forming smaller pockets. Make sure you only stitch to the casing line.
35. Insert the dowel rods and hand stitch the ends of the casings to keep them from sliding out.

36. Add your hoops and accessories. Zip it up and secure with the velcro tab to store or carry to class.
